Dear Stakeholders,

Senate Bill (SB) 1 appropriated \$100 million a year from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA) for the Active Transportation Program (ATP) starting in fiscal year 17-18. The 2017 ATP Augmentation Guidelines (Guidelines), adopted by the California Transportation Commission (Commission) on June 29, 2017, address the use of the ATP RMRA funds for fiscal years 17-18 and 18-19. Project Eligibility

Funding for the 2017 ATP Augmentation will only be available to:

- Projects programmed in the adopted 2017 ATP that can be delivered earlier than currently programmed.
- Projects that applied for funding in the 2017 ATP but were not selected for funding.

Supplemental Application Material

Applicants must submit the documents below to be considered for the 2017 ATP Augmentation:

- Updated Schedule and Funding Plan.
- Authorization Letter signed by the Chief Executive Officer or other officer authorized by the applicant's governing board.

In addition to the two required documents above, applicants may submit a one-page application update that explains any significant changes to the project since the original application submittal.

The 2017 ATP Augmentation Guidelines should be consulted for additional requirements including information on project eligibility, application submittals, project selection criteria, and project evaluations.
