Subject: 2018 LOCAL PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM - FORMULAIC PROGRAM FUNDING SHARE DISTRIBUTION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2017-18 AND 2018-19 (RESOLUTION G-17-42)

ISSUE:

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission), pursuant to the approved 2018 Local Partnership Program Guidelines, adopt the Formulaic Program funding share distribution for Fiscal Years 2017-18 and 2018-19?

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Commission adopt the share distribution for the Formulaic Program of projects for Fiscal Years 2017-18 and 2018-19 as outlined in the Eligible Submittals and Proposed Formulaic Shares for the 2018 Local Partnership Program (Attachment A).

BACKGROUND:

On October 18, 2017 the Commission adopted the 2018 Local Partnership Program Guidelines in response to the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, Senate Bill (SB) 1 (Beall, Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017), as amended by Assembly Bill (AB) 115 (Ting, Chapter 20, Statutes of 2017) and AB 135 (Committee on Budget, Chapter 255, Statutes of 2017). The overall objective of the Local Partnership Program is to reward counties, cities, and regional transportation agencies with voter-approved fees or taxes solely dedicated to transportation improvements or that have enacted fees solely dedicated to transportation. In compliance with the guidelines, the Commission will adopt a Formulaic Program of projects for the initial cycle that will cover 2017-18 and 2018-19 for jurisdictions with voter approved taxes, tolls, and fees that are dedicated solely to transportation purposes.

Jurisdictions interested in receiving a Formulaic Program funding share submitted eligibility information as outlined in the Local Partnership Program Guidelines by the October 27, 2017 deadline. Commission staff reviewed the eligibility information and qualifying jurisdictions were issued a proposed share that was posted for review on the Commission Website on November 13, 2017. Commission staff solicited feedback to ensure affected jurisdictions had an opportunity to review, comment or request modifications prior to the December 6-7, 2017 Commission meeting.

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Commission staff received feedback on a number of comments. Based on comments received, staff revised the proposed shares and posted the revised shares to the Commission's website on November 15, 2017.

Resolution G-17-42

- 1.1 WHEREAS, on April 28, 2017, the Governor signed Senate Bill (SB) 1 (Beall, Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017), known as the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, creating the Local Partnership Program to provide funding to jurisdictions that have sought and received voter approved taxes and imposed fees for road maintenance and rehabilitation and other transportation improvement projects; and
- 1.2 WHEREAS, on June 27, 2017, the Governor signed Assembly Bill (AB) 115 (Ting, Chapter 20, Statutes of 2017) which clarified language in SB 1 regarding local and regional transportation agency eligibility and expanded the types of projects eligible for program funding; and
- **1.3 WHEREAS**, the Commission adopted the 2018 Local Partnership Program Guidelines on October 18, 2017; and
- **1.4 WHEREAS,** consistent with the Commission's Local Partnership Program Guidelines, the proposed Formulaic Program distribution of shares for jurisdictions to review and comment was published on November 13, 2017; and
- **1.5 WHEREAS,** the Local Partnership Program Guidelines require the Commission to adopt the Formulaic Program distribution of shares on December 6-7, 2017.
- 2.1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the California Transportation Commission adopts the attached Eligible Submittals and Proposed Formulaic Shares for the 2018 Local Partnership Program for Fiscal Years 2017-18 and 2018-19; and
- **2.2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Commission staff is authorized to make minor technical changes as needed to the Eligible Submittals and Proposed Formulaic Shares for the 2018 Local Partnership Program; and
- 2.3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Commission directs staff to post the Eligible Submittals and Proposed Formulaic Shares for the 2018 Local Partnership Program on the Commission's website.
