

LOCAL PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM



Program Objective:

- Provide funding to counties, cities, districts, and regional transportation agencies in which voters have approved
 - fees or taxes dedicated solely to transportation improvements, or
 - have imposed fees, including uniform developer fees, dedicated solely to transportation improvements.



LOCAL PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

• Funding: \$200 million per year 2020 Cycle (adopted December 2020) • 3 years of programming - \$600 million • FYs 2020-21, 2021-22, 2022-23 Program Distribution 60% Formulaic - \$108 million 0 40% Competitive - \$72 million 0 Incentive Set-Aside - \$20 million 0




