Subject: **ALLOCATION AMENDMENT FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM PROJECT**  
**RESOLUTION FATP-1920-05, AMENDING RESOLUTION FATP-1819-14**

### **ISSUE:**

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve an amendment to Resolution FATP-1819-14, originally approved in June 2019, for the Colorado Boulevard Pedestrian and Bicycle Active Transportation Improvements project (PPNO 5137), in Los Angeles County, to split the allocated amount of \$8,305,000 in federal funds to \$1,012,000 in State funds and \$7,293,000 federal funds?

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The California Department of Transportation (Department) recommends that the Commission approve an amendment to Resolution FATP-1819-14 for the Colorado Boulevard Pedestrian and Bicycle Active Transportation Improvements project (PPNO 5137), in Los Angeles County, to split the allocated amount of \$8,305,000 in federal funds to \$1,012,000 in State funds and \$7,293,000 federal funds.

### **BACKGROUND:**

At the June 2019 meeting, the Commission approved a total allocation of \$8,305,000 for the Colorado Boulevard Pedestrian and Bicycle Active Transportation Improvements project in Los Angeles County, for construction.

The project was allocated for a total of \$8,305,000 in federal funds. However, the project should have been allocated with \$7,293,000 in federal funds and \$1,012,000 in State funds. The Department would like to amend the current total allocated amount of \$8,305,000 in

federal funds as \$7,293,000 in federal funds and \$1,012,000 in State funds. The total allocated amount does not change. There are no other changes to the vote box.

The required changes are reflected in strikethrough and bold in the attached revised vote box for the project.

**FINANCIAL RESOLUTION:**

Be it resolved, that the split to the allocated amount to both federal and state funds for the Colorado Boulevard Pedestrian and Bicycle Active Transportation Improvements project (PPNO 5137) in Los Angeles County, originally approved under Resolution FATP-1819-14, is hereby amended in accordance with the attached revised attachment.
