ISSUE:

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve an amendment to revise Resolution FM-18-03, originally approved at the June 2019 meeting, for the Fiscal Year 2019-20 State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP) Minor Program?

RECOMMENDATION:

The California Department of Transportation (Department) recommends that the Commission approve an amendment to revise Resolution FM-18-03 for the 2019-20 SHOPP Minor Program.

BACKGROUND:

At the June 2019 meeting, the Commission approved Resolution FM-18-03 which allocated \$150,000,000 for the 2019-20 SHOPP Minor Program, however at the time the Commission approved the Department's request, it did not include the following summary total breakdown:
