#### Subject: REQUEST TO AMEND THE PERIOD OF PROJECT COMPLETION FOR PREVIOUSLY APPROVED TIME EXTENSIONS FOR ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS, PER THE INTERIM TIMELY USE OF FUNDS POLICY WAIVER 20-60

## ISSUE:

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission) amend the period of project completion for four projects, programmed in the Active Transportation Program (ATP), for the time periods identified in the attachment?

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The California Department of Transportation (Department) recommends the Commission amend the period of project completion for four projects, programmed in the ATP, for the time period identified in the attachment.

## BACKGROUND:

The Commission allocated \$9,008,000 for the construction of four ATP projects identified in the attachment. At this time, these agencies will not be able to complete their projects by their completion deadlines due to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. The attachment shows the details of the projects and the explanations for the delays. The project sponsors are requesting extensions, and the regional planning agencies concur. The respective agencies request extensions in accordance with program guidelines.

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Current ATP Guidelines stipulate that a local agency has up to 36 months from the time of contract award to accept the contract. The local agency has 180 days after the contract acceptance to prepare and submit the final invoices and reports to the Department. The Guidelines further stipulate that the Commission may approve a one-time only waiver to the project completion deadline, for up to 12 months. However, under the adopted Interim Timely Use of Funds policy, an extension can be requested for up to 20-months for each delivery milestone, where permissible by statute, to address impacts to project delivery as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

## Safe Routes to School Education and Enforcement Programs and Pilots project

The City of Los Angeles (City) requests a 12-month time extension amendment to complete construction (CON) of the non-infrastructure Safe Route to School Education and Encouragement Programs and Pilots program. The City has experienced some unexpected challenges with completing the program as anticipated.

The City awarded the program in December 2016 and proceeded with implementing the program. The City originally anticipated completing the program within the allotted 36-months and in alignment with the school years. However, the City is requesting a completion extension to ensure that the Safe Routes to School resources and programs funded through this grant, can be delivered and implemented with continuity at schools for the full school year, as the 36-month period is scheduled to end on December 31, 2019. This will negatively affect the program if only half of the school year can be implemented, as the City fully anticipates completing the program by August 2020. However, as the COVID-19 pandemic continues to spread across the city, various ordinances have been put into place for the safety of the public. The City is experiencing delays from various agencies and entities involved with the project closeout. As a response, all school engagement activities were suspended beginning March 13, 2020 with a mandated shelter in place directive. It is unknown when this directive will expire, and the implementation of the program can resume. The additional time will provide all parties involved with enough time to obtain the final report and finalize all required documents to close out the project.

Therefore, the City is requesting to amend Waiver 19-27, originally approved in May 2019, from an 8 to **20**-month completion time extension to August **31**, 2020 August **31**, 2021.

## Top 50 Safe Routes to School Safety Assessments and Travel Plans project

The City of Los Angeles (City) requests a 12-month time extension amendment to complete the construction/non-infrastructure (CON-NI) of Top 50 Safe Routes to School Safety Assessment and Travel Plans project. The City desires to proactively manage plan development and seeks to adjust the schedule to align with a full school year.

The City received a CON-NI allocation in June 2016 and awarded a consultant contract in December 2016. The City is requesting to extend completion of the project to Summer 2020 to ensure that the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) staff can complete plan development, review and cost analysis for the remaining 11 SRTS plans. With the approval of the extension, the City can leverage the full school year to complete the project rather than have the contract end in the middle of the school year. To date, the City has completed 18 SRTS Travel Plans. However, as the COVID-19 pandemic continues to spread across the city, various ordinances have been put into place for the safety of the public. The City is experiencing delays from various agencies and entities involved with the project closeout. As a response, all school engagement activities were suspended beginning March 13, 2020 with a mandated shelter in place directive. It is unknown when this directive will expire, and the implementation of the program can resume. The additional time will provide all parties involved with enough time to obtain the final report and finalize all required documents to close out the project.

Therefore, the City is requesting to amend Waiver 19-54, originally approved in August 2019, from an 8 to **20**-month completion time extension to August **31**, 2020 **August 31**, 2021.
