Subject: SECOND QUARTER - BALANCE REPORT ON AB 1012 "USE IT OR LOSE IT"

PROVISION FOR FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR 2018 UNOBLIGATED RSTP AND

CMAQ FUNDS

SUMMARY:

As of March 31, 2020, the Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) has approximately \$6.9 million and the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ) has approximately \$64,000 that are subject to reprogramming on November 2020.

BACKGROUND:

The Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act was enacted in 1991 and was in effect for six years. During that time, the Regions only obligated 87 percent of their federal funding. The next Federal Highway Act, known as the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21), was signed into law in 1998. During the first two years of TEA-21, the Regions' obligation of federal funds declined to 41 percent. By October 1999, the Regions had accumulated a \$1.2 billion backlog in federal apportionments and \$854 million in Obligation Authority (OA).

Assembly Bill (AB) 1012 was enacted on October 10, 1999 (Chapter 783, Statutes of 1999), with a goal of improving the delivery of transportation projects and addressing the backlog of the Regions' federal apportionments and OA. AB 1012 states that RSTP and CMAQ funds not obligated within the first three years of federal eligibility are subject to reprogramming by the California Transportation Commission in the fourth year to prevent the funds from being lost by the State.

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The annual notice to the Regions, under AB 1012 "Use It or Lose It" provisions for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2018 (October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018), was released on November 22, 2019. The total FFY 2018 funds identified as subject to reprogramming under the provisions of AB 1012 were approximately \$74 million. This included approximately \$74 million of RSTP funds and approximately \$102 thousand of CMAQ funds. As of March 31, 2020, the RSTP amount has decreased to \$6,943,252 and the CMAQ amount has decreased to \$64,366.

The California Department of Transportation (Department) is responsible for monitoring and reporting unobligated balances. Each month, the Department provides notification to the Regions of the unobligated RSTP and CMAQ balances that have one year remaining under the AB 1012 guidelines. Beginning in FFY 2000, and continuing through FFY 2019, the Department's local partners have delivered enough projects to obligate a minimum of 100 percent of the available OA. The Department anticipates to fully deliver for the 21st consecutive year.
