**Subject:** Amendment to the Local Partnership Formulaic Funding Distribution to add Incentive Funding for one Eligible Jurisdiction, Resolution LPP-P-1920-08

#### **Recommendation:**

Staff recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve, by resolution, the amendment to the Local Partnership Formulaic Funding Distribution to add incentive funding for the City and County of San Francisco, totaling \$5,000,000 in Fiscal Year 2020-21.

#### <u>lssue:</u>

The City and County of San Francisco informed Commission staff of their successful new voter-approved 25-year business excise tax measure (Proposition D), which is effective January 1, 2020. Commission staff reviewed the documents submitted by the agency to verify eligibility and establish the incentive funding amounts.

Approval of this amendment to the Local Partnership Formulaic Program Funding Share Distribution will add \$5,000,000 of incentive funding to the City and County of San Francisco. The incentive funding is available for programming through June 30, 2021. Therefore, the setaside incentive funding amount for Fiscal Year 2020-21 will be reduced by \$5,000,000 to \$15,000,000 for eligible jurisdictions.

Unused incentive funding will be redistributed based on the program funding distribution (60 percent via formulaic and 40 percent via competitive) in the next fiscal year.

## Background:

Senate Bill (SB) 1 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017), which created the Local Partnership Program, was signed by the Governor on April 28, 2017.

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Assembly Bill 115 (Chapter 20, Statutes of 2017), signed by the Governor on June 27, 2017, clarified SB 1 language regarding local and regional transportation agency eligibility and expanded the types of projects eligible for the program. The objective of the Local Partnership Formulaic Program is to reward counties, cities, districts, and regional transportation agencies in which voters have approved fees or taxes solely dedicated to transportation improvements.

On March 25, 2020, the Commission adopted the 2020 Local Partnership Formulaic Funding Distribution for Fiscal Years 2020-21 through 2022-23, which included formulaic funding for 44 agencies and set-aside incentive funding of \$20,000,000 annually.

The Local Partnership Formulaic Program recognizes new or renewed voter approved selfhelp efforts and incentivizes jurisdictions to pursue future tax measures, tolls, or fees. Onetime incentive funding is provided to jurisdictions that seek and receive voter approval of new or renewed tax measures, tolls, or fees, if those tax measures, tolls, and fees have a minimum period of ten-years, are dedicated solely to transportation, and, for sales taxes are equal to or greater than one quarter cent.

The incentive funding is equal to the jurisdiction's projected annual revenue of the voterapproved tax initiative, not to exceed \$5,000,000 per measure and \$20,000,000 total annually.

On November 5, 2019, the City and County of San Francisco successfully passed a new voterapproved tax measure, Proposition D. This measure imposes a business excise tax on the net rider fares for rides facilitated by commercial ride-share companies and rides provided by autonomous vehicles and private transit services vehicles, to fund transportation operations and infrastructure for traffic congestion mitigation in the City. The tax went into effect on January 1, 2020 with a projected annual revenue estimated at \$32 million.

## Resolution LPP-P-1920-08

Be it Resolved, that the Commission does hereby approve the amendment to the Local Partnership Formulaic Funding Distribution to add incentive funding for the City and County of San Francisco, totaling \$5,000,000 in Fiscal Year 2020-21.
