



Marysville to Oroville 2010-2020










Current Roadway Conditions Near the Patterson's Parcel












Proposed Safety Improvements

The acquisition is needed to accommodate the safety elements of this project



The design minimizes as much as practicable, R/W impacts to residences, businesses, and utilities throughout the project limits.

This is accomplished in this section of the project by widening to the west, impacting the Patterson parcel, resulting in fewer overall impacts than widening to the east.

This leaves both a viable business and a functioning residence for the Patterson's.



An offer of just compensation has been made in accordance with Government Code 7267.2.

- The Department established an amount that it believes to be Just Compensation, which included an assessment of severance damages.
- The appraisal was cumulatively reviewed and approved on 11/8/2019.
- The Department made an offer for the amount of Just Compensation on 11/27/2019.
- The Department has met the requirements of Federal and State laws as well as Departmental policies.

In addition, the Department continues to work with the property owners toward a negotiated settlement.

Remaining matters are compensation related issues.
