

## G-12 Progress Report through August 2021

- G-12's represent delegated authority to make adjustments (increases or decreases) to project funding.
- Through August 2021, Caltrans has processed the following changes:
  - SHOPP: Approximately \$10 million in increases from 15 projects, and \$30 million in savings from 23 projects.
  - STIP: \$1 million in increases from two projects, and \$437,600 in savings from one project.


### August Redistribution

- August Redistribution (AR) is the process wherein the FHWA redistributes unused Obligation Authority to States with a demonstrated need
  - California has been quite successful in past years
    - Approximately \$2.9 billion over the last 10 years
    - For 2021, California received approximately \$402 million
  - AR funds must be obligated immediately on previously allocated projects already under advance construction




#### **10-Year California August Redistribution**
