

# Decision-making & Recommendations Processes

- Collaboration
  - Staff and DACAG officers communicate regularly
  - Attorneys provide guidance and options
  - o Commissioners are active
- Transparency
  - Staff makes presentations to inform and obtain input
  - o Staff clarifies how and when input will be used
- Receptivity
  - Commissioners want and take advice seriously
  - Staff appreciate input
- Process
  - DACAG provides advice through letters
  - Submits verbal or written comments



### **Equity Framework**

#### **DEFINITION OF DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES**

As defined in the Energy Equity Indicators tool, the Disadvantaged Communities Advisory Group (DAC AG) will adopt as the definition and advocate for equitable programming to reach all of the following communities (including community residents, workers, and businesses):

- ◆ CalEnviroScreen, as defined by Cal EPA,
- ◆ Tribal Lands,
- ◆ Census tracts with area median household income/state median income, less than 80%, and
- ◆ Households with median household income less than 80% of Area Median Income (AMI).

## Stipends


 Reasonable expenses and per diem covered for attending publicly-noticed meetings

- Reasonable expenses include:
  - transportation
  - lodging
  - meals
  - Incidentals
- No per diem for preparation work
- No intervenor compensation
- Abide by Standard Form 262
- Must use state's Travel Expense Claim (TEC) process and submit to CPUC

- Upon entry, check business interests (Form 700)
- Advocacy by organizations of DACAG members
- Comments made during meetings
- Applying for grants administered by agencies
- Representing or speaking on behalf of the DACAG
