SUMMARY:

The California Transportation Plan (CTP) Implementation Progress Report Update details the progress made implementing the recommendations of the CTP 2050. The California Department of Transportation (Department) will use a programmatic approach to track and record CTP implementation annually.

BACKGROUND:

The CTP is the legislatively mandated long-range transportation plan for the state of California. The plan provides a common framework for guiding investments by all levels of government and the private sector. The plan provides a vision and blueprint for future transportation decision making over a 25-year planning horizon. The CTP is updated every five years to reflect new statewide policy, research, and technological advancements for both land use and transportation.

During the public review period for the CTP 2050, the California Transportation Commission (Commission) provided a comment letter which requested the Department to provide an annual report highlighting implementation progress of the CTP. The Commission and the Department discussed implementation during ongoing phases of CTP development, and continue to work toward monitoring and recording progress achieved in implementing the CTP 2050 statewide. The Department will also utilize annual progress reporting to inform future iterations of the CTP.

Furthermore, Department partnered with the California State Transportation Agency to include and highlight long-range planning efforts of the Climate Action Plan for Transportation Infrastructure (CAPTI). All future implementation reporting of the CTP will now integrate CAPTI policy implementation. Ongoing statewide coordination with partners helps to improve the effectiveness of the long-range transportation planning process. Caltrans will continue to collaborate with stakeholders to implement CTP and CAPTI policy at all levels of state government.
