This letter expresses my excitement and gratitude for the Active Transportation Program staff recommendations that propose funding six essential projects in Santa Cruz County. As the State Senator for Senate District 17, I know firsthand the profound positive impact these projects will have in our community. As the former Secretary of the CA Natural Resources Agency, I understand the threats we face from climate change and how these projects will help us strive towards a cleaner and greener future.

Coastal Rail Trail Segments 8 and 9 and Segments 10 and 11 in particular will be transformational for our region.
