RESOLUTION FATP-2223-27

ISSUE:

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve an allocation of \$22,922,000 for 18 locally-administered Active Transportation Program (ATP) projects, off the State Highway System?

RECOMMENDATION:

The California Department of Transportation recommends that the Commission approve an allocation of \$22,922,000 for 18 locally-administered ATP projects, off the State Highway System.

BACKGROUND:

The attached vote list describes 18 locally-administered ATP projects totaling \$22,922,000. The local agencies are ready to proceed with these projects, and are requesting an allocation at this time.

FINANCIAL RESOLUTION:

Resolved that \$22,922,000 be allocated from the Budget Act of 2021 and 2022, Budget Act Items 2660-102-0001, and 2660-108-0890 for 18 locally-administered ATP projects described on the attached vote list.
