Subject: STIP AMENDMENT 22S-29 (ACTION)

PPNO 6421 - TULARE COUNTY PPNO 2604 - SHASTA COUNTY

<u>ACTION UPDATE</u>: Due to the recission of CRSSAA funds, the Shasta Regional Transportation Agency and Tulare County Association of Governments requests 'state only

funds' in lieu of COVID-RIP9 funds.

<u>ISSUE:</u>

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the requested State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Amendment 22S-29?

RECOMMENDATION:

The Shasta Regional Transportation Agency (SRTA) and the Tulare County Association of Governments (TCAG) requests that the Commission consider the requested STIP Amendment 22S-29. This item was noticed at the Commission's May 2023 meeting.

The SRTA and TCAG propose to lapse \$1,311,000 of COVID-Regional Improvement Program (RIP) funding from the Cottonwood Lasso Bicycle/Pedestrian Project (CATTLE) in Shasta County (PPNO 2604), and program \$1,311,000 of COVID-RIP funds to the SR 99/Caldwell Avenue Interchange project (PPNO 6421), in Tulare County. SRTA will exchange \$1,311,000 in COVID-RIP shares with TCAG for \$1,311,000 in TCAG's RIP shares for the CATTLE project (PPNO 2604), which will be requested at a future Commission meeting.

BACKGROUND:

The Shasta County's CATTLE project (PPNO 2604) is currently overprogrammed by \$1,611,000 in Plans, Specification & Estimate in 2022-23 (\$1,311,000 in COVID-RIP shares and \$350,000 in RIP shares).

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Since COVID-RIP shares are federal funds and need to be allocated before June 2024, SRTA is requesting to lapse these funds. Tulare's Caldwell interchange project will utilize the COVID-RIP funds in 2023-24 and return funds to SRTA in regular RIP shares through the RTIP process proposed for the Construction phase of CATTLE project.

As a result of this exchange of COVID-RIP funding, TCAG is requesting to reduce the regular STIP-RIP funding for the construction phase of its Caldwell Interchange project by \$1,311,000, from \$7,000,000 to \$5,689,000, and programming \$1,311,000 in Shasta County COVID-RIP funding in 2023-24.

A Memorandum of Understanding has been approved by the Board of Directors of SRTA and TCAG. TCAG and SRTA communicated to the Commission about the exchange of COVID-RIP funds. And the programming changes will be made and approved by the Commission respectively to TCAG's and SRTA's respective fund balances to reflect the exchange of funds. In addition, TCAG and SRTA will work together to ensure that a project in Shasta County is programmed appropriately using the unprogrammed \$1,311,000 in Tulare County's RIP shares during the RTIP process.

The proposed funding plan for the project is shown on the following page.
