Subject: PROJECT STATUS OF THE EMERGENCY ALLOCATION FOR A STATE

TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM RAIL PROJECT - SAN

CLEMENTE TRACK PROTECTION (MP 204.6) PROJECT IN ORANGE COUNTY

(PPNO TC131) PER RESOLUTION G-23-20

SUMMARY:

Following an emergency declared by the Director of the California Department of Transportation (Department), on June 16, 2023, per Government Code Section 14533(a), the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approved an emergency allocation on June 20, 2023 from the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Interregional Program (IIP) shares, of \$3,000,000 to the Southern California Regional Rail Authority for the San Clemente Track Protection (MP 204.6) Project (PPNO TC131), in Orange County. In accordance with Resolution G-23-20, approved by the Commission on June 20, 2023, the Department will provide a status update on the project at the next Commission meeting following the emergency allocation.

BACKGROUND:

California statute prohibits the Commission from allocating funds to an unprogrammed project except in certain situations. However, under Government Code Section 14533(a), it authorizes the Commission to allocate funding in response to an emergency condition which has placed either people or property in jeopardy or which has caused or threatens to cause closure of a critical transportation facility or access to it.

This project is located on the Los Angeles-San Diego-San Luis Obispo (LOSSAN) rail corridor, which carries between 3,000 and 5,000 passengers daily, and is also designated as a national defense connector line as part of the Strategic Rail Corridor Network by the Department of Defense. Passenger rail travel on the LOSSAN corridor is suspended, and freight rail is operating at a speed restriction of 10 mph in the project area, which has been deemed

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unstable due to falling debris from two landslides from an adjacent property, in the City of San Clemente.

PROJECT STATUS:

To restore and maintain passenger and freight rail service in the project area, the emergency construction of a temporary barrier wall is needed to stabilize the landslide and protect the impacted tracks from debris. A preliminary concept designed under a design-build contract will build a temporary barrier soldier pile or similar type wall, in the vicinity of mile post 204.6 to capture any potential debris or soil from the hill to protect the tracks. To date, all the piles and lagging or wooden planks between piles have been installed and completed. Ongoing efforts are in progress on temporary relocation of a signal line which had to be removed as part of the project. The temporary barrier wall will be removed by a contractor, under a separate contract, approximately in one year as the City of San Clemente explores implementing a long-term stability solution.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

On June 20, 2023, \$3,000,000 was approved from the Budget Act of 2022, Budget Act Item 2660-301-0046 for the emergency allocation of the San Clemente Track Protection (MP 204.6) Project (PPNO TC131), described on the attached vote list, and in accordance with Government Code Section 14533(a). The STIP's interregional shares will be adjusted accordingly.
