DRAFT CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION CARBON REDUCTION STRATEGY

California Transportation Commission

BACKGROUND



\$110m Annual CRP

\$70m Local CRP

\$40m State CRP

Established by Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

 Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) funds to reduce on-road transportation carbon-dioxide emissions

\$110 million to California per year for five years

- 65% apportioned based on population to MPOs and rural RTPAs (Local CRP)
- 35% awarded through competitive program led by Caltrans (State CRP)

Each state to develop a Carbon Reduction Strategy

- Due November 15, 2023 to FHWA
- Directs use of CRP

 Summarize existing state plans and policies (CAPTI, CTP 2050, CARB Scoping Plan, Legislation, EOs)

Regional Strategies

- Highlights projects from approved Regional Transportation Plans
- 'Three pillars': ZEV, rail and transit, and active transportation

Carbon Reduction Program Funds

- Direction on use of funds
- Links to draft State CRP Guidance and Proposal Form

LOCAL CRP



65% of CRP funds \$70 million per year

Each MPO and rural RTPA selects their own projects

- No prescribed scoring criteria
- Projects must align with the 'three pillars'
- Must be performance-driven and region-wide

FY 2022 and FY 2023 apportionments are available

- About 50% of funds have been programmed to-date
- Props to the Southern California, San Diego, Tahoe, Fresno, Humboldt, Sacramento, Kern, Butte, and Shasta regions

- CARB Scoping Plan

<u>Fund conversions of existing lanes to priced</u> managed lanes

- Must commit to investing a portion of net toll revenues in low-carbon transportation options
- Caltrans-led or partner-led projects eligible
- Administered through the SHOPP

Performance-driven project selection criteria

- Greenhouse gas emissions
- Vehicle miles traveled
- Travel time reliability
- Transportation equity
- Low-carbon transportation options
- Deliverability
- Partnership

STATE CRP cont.



35% of CRP funds \$40 million per year

Draft guidance and proposal form

- Details project eligibility and process
- Comments accepted through August 18, 2023

All five years adopted in 2023: \$200m

- Sept 5: Call for proposals through Caltrans Districts
- Oct 31: Proposals due to Caltrans HQ
- November: Project scoring and prioritization
- December 5: Amend 2022 SHOPP to program selected projects
