Declaration for the Los Angeles Valley Bikeway and Greenway Project - Vanalden

Avenue to Balboa Boulevard, Resolution E-23-151

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission), as a Responsible Agency, accept the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Los Angeles Valley Bikeway and Greenway Project - Vanalden Avenue to Balboa Boulevard (Project) in the City of Los Angeles in Los Angeles County and approve the Project for future funding consideration.

Issue:

The City of Los Angeles (City) is the California Environmental Quality Act lead agency for the Project. The Project is located along the Los Angeles River extending from Vanalden Avenue to Balboa Boulevard in the West San Fernando Valley of the City of Los Angeles in Los Angeles County. On-street improvements would be located at the following: Vanalden Avenue/Victory Boulevard intersection; Vanalden Avenue from Vanowen Street south to the Los Angeles River; Los Angeles River south to Calvert Street; Yolanda Avenue from the Los Angeles River south to Erwin Street; Los Angeles River to Vanowen Boulevard; Los Angeles River to northbound White Oak Avenue; Kittridge Street from Reseda Boulevard east to White Oak Avenue; Etiwanda Avenue from Oxnard north to Vanowen Street; and the Birmingham High School Campus Driveway/Victory Boulevard Intersection. The Project includes the installation of bicycle and pedestrian pathways, construction of undercrossings and river parks, and on-street improvements to increase access to the Los Angeles River Bikeway.

For all projects that are anticipated to be funded through a program under the purview of the Commission, full compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act is required. The Commission will not allocate funds to projects for design, right-of-way, or construction until the environmental document is complete, and the Commission has approved the environmentally cleared project for future funding consideration.

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Background:

On May 4, 2022, the City adopted the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Project and found that the Project would not have a significant effect on the environment after mitigation. On November 8, 2023, the City confirmed that the environmental document remains valid; there are no new impacts requiring mitigation; and the Project set forth in the environmental document is consistent with the Project's scope of work programmed by the Commission.

Impacts that require mitigation measures to be reduced to less than significant levels relate to biological resources, cultural resources, and tribal cultural resources. Mitigation measures include avoidance and monitoring of Least Bell's vireo (a bird species), obtaining permits from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and California Department of Fish and Wildlife, construction timing to avoid bat maternity season and bird breeding as feasible, preconstruction biological surveys, implementation of Best Management Practices for erosion, spills, washout, and trash during construction, and implementation of standard unanticipated discovery measures for cultural resources.

The Project is estimated to cost \$65,000,000 and is funded with local City and County (\$31,207,000); Metro Measure M (\$15,000,000); and Active Transportation Program (\$18,793,000) funds.

Construction is estimated to begin in fiscal year 2024-25.
