# Subject: ALLOCATION FOR TRANSIT AND INTERCITY RAIL CAPITAL <u>PROGRAM PROJECTS</u> <u>RESOLUTION TIRCP-2324-51</u>

# ISSUE:

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve an allocation of \$21,154,000 for five Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP) projects?

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

The California Department of Transportation recommends that the Commission approve an allocation of \$21,154,000 for five TIRCP projects.

## BACKGROUND:

The attached vote list describes five TIRCP projects totaling \$21,154,000. The local agencies are ready to proceed with these projects, and are requesting an allocation at this time.

## **FINANCIAL RESOLUTION:**

Resolved that \$21,154,000 be allocated from the Budget Act of 2022 and 2023, Budget Act Items 2660-101-0046 and 2660-301-0046R for five TIRCP projects described on the attached vote list.
