PROJECTS ON THE STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM

RESOLUTION LPP-A-2324-44

ISSUE:

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve an allocation of \$6,720,000 for two locally-administered Senate Bill 1 (SB 1) Local Partnership Program (LPP) (Formulaic and Competitive) projects, on the State Highway System?

RECOMMENDATION:

The California Department of Transportation recommends that the Commission approve an allocation of \$6,720,000 for two locally-administered SB 1 LPP (Formulaic and Competitive) projects as follows:

2.5s.(5a) - \$1,400,000 for one Formulaic project, and

2.5s.(5b) - \$5,320,000 for one Competitive project.

BACKGROUND:

The attached vote list describes two locally-administered SB 1 LPP (Formulaic and Competitive) projects totaling \$6,720,000. The local agencies are ready to proceed with these projects, and are requesting an allocation at this time.
