Subject: REQUEST TO EXTEND THE PERIOD OF PROJECT ALLOCATION FOR STATE

HIGHWAY OPERATION AND PROTECTION PROGRAM PROJECTS

WAIVER 24-125

ISSUE:

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission) extend the period of project allocation for 164 State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP) projects totaling \$5,792,897,000, as shown on the attachment?

RECOMMENDATION:

The California Department of Transportation (Department) recommends that the Commission extend the period of project allocation for 164 SHOPP projects totaling \$5,792,897,000, (\$4,180,571,000 for construction capital, \$200,986,000 for Right of Way capital, \$614,052,000 for construction engineering and \$797,288,000 for preconstruction phases), as shown on the attachment.

BACKGROUND:

The SHOPP Guidelines stipulate that the Commission may approve waivers to the timely use of funds deadline one-time only for up to 20 months in accordance with Government Code Section 14529.8. These project considerations were deferred at the June 2024 Commission meeting.
