Subject: <u>ALLOCATION AMENDMENT FOR A TRANSIT AND INTERCITY RAIL</u> <u>CAPITAL PROGRAM COMPONENT</u> <u>RESOLUTION TIRCP-2425-09, AMENDING RESOLUTION TIRCP-2324-43</u>

ISSUE:

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve an allocation amendment for the Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP) (2022:6) Making a Beeline for Electrification (Network Integration) component (PPNO CP082N), in Los Angeles County, to revise the project description, outcomes/outputs, and the phase from Right of Way (RW) to Construction (CON)?

RECOMMENDATION:

The California Department of Transportation recommends that the Commission approve an allocation amendment for the TIRCP (2022:6) Making a Beeline for Electrification (Network Integration) component (PPNO CP082N), in Los Angeles County, to revise the project description, outcome/outputs, and the phase from RW to CON.

BACKGROUND:

In January 2024, the Commission approved \$100,000 for the RW phase of the TIRCP (2022:6) Making a Beeline for Electrification (Network Integration) component (PPNO CP082N), under Resolution TIRCP-2324-43. At the time of allocation, the phase was entered incorrectly and the description and outcome/outputs didn't include all the details for the component scope of work. This revision is necessary to accurately reflect the phase and elaborate on the description and outcome/outputs.

The proposed changes are reflected in strikethrough and bold in the attached revised vote box. There is no change to the allocation amount.
