Subject: LOCAL TRANSPORTATION CLIMATE ADAPTATION PROGRAM

FISCAL YEAR 2023-24 SEMI-ANNUAL REPORT

SUMMARY:

As required by the revised Senate Bill 1 Accountability and Transparency Guidelines (SB 1 Guidelines), adopted by the California Transportation Commission (Commission) on March 16, 2023, the California Department of Transportation (Department) will present its Local Transportation Climate Adaptation Program (LTCAP) Semi-Annual Progress Report for Fiscal Year 2023-24 to the Commission at its October 2024 meeting as an informational item. This Semi-Annual Progress Report for 2023-24 covers the period of January 1, 2024, through June 30, 2024. This report includes an overall program update and a status for all 15 awarded projects, funded primarily from Senate Bill 198 (SB 198), and federally apportioned formula funding from the Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT) Formula Program.

BACKGROUND:

SB 198 (Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review, Chapter 71, Statutes of 2022) established the Commission's competitive LTCAP to provide funding for the development and implementation of projects that adapt local surface transportation infrastructure to climate change effects. Additionally, SB 198 added a one-time appropriation of \$148 million in state funding and directed the allocation of federally apportioned formula funding from the PROTECT Formula Program. In total, the program will provide \$400.5 million over five years.

For the 2023 LTCAP Cycle 1, Commission staff recommended funding 15 projects worth over \$578 million in total project costs. The recommended projects exceed the programming capacity by \$12.8 million, which will be taken from the programming capacity for Cycle 2 of the LTCAP.

CHAIR AND COMMISSIONERS CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

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As a condition of project selection and allocation, implementing agencies are required to submit reports quarterly to the Department on activities and progress made toward implementation of projects. The purpose of this reporting requirement is to ensure that projects achieve the goals and benefits of the program, and that projects are executed in a timely fashion and are within the scope and budget identified at the time of selection.

The purpose of this report is to provide information on the projects in the Local Transportation Climate Adaptation Program (LTCAP).

Background

The primary objective of the LTCAP is to provide support for eligible applicants as they develop and implement local surface transportation infrastructure projects that address climate change effects, improve transportation and community resiliency to natural hazards and disasters, and advance environmental justice by directly benefitting climate-vulnerable, underserved, and under-resourced communities.

The LTCAP's Cycle 1 was funded through a one-time appropriation of \$148 million from the State Highway Account (SHA), as approved in the Budget Act of Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2024 and approximately \$50.5 million per year for three years from the Federal PROTECT Formula Program. LTCAP Cycle 1 provided a total funding amount of \$296.5 million. The California Transportation Commission (Commission) included a set-aside of 5% of total funding for federally recognized Tribal applicants. Projects in the first cycle were programmed in FYs 2023-24, 2024-25, and 2025-26. However, the SHA appropriation of \$148 million was programmed and allocated in FY 2024-25 as required by statute.

Summary of Cycle 1 (Awarded December 2023)

Cycle 1 of the LTCAP received 22 applications and awarded \$309.271 million to 15 projects, which included \$161.765 million from the Federal PROTECT funds and a one-time appropriation of \$147.506 million from the SB 198 funds. Of the 15 projects awarded to local agencies, two projects will be implemented by the California Department of Transportation (Department).

The recommended projects provide adaptation measures to current and future climate challenges that threaten existing transportation infrastructure assets, imperil the ability of communities to withstand and recover from extreme weather events, and reduce long-term, life cycle infrastructure costs by avoiding future damage, maintenance, and reconstruction impacts from changing climate conditions. The selected projects improve transportation and community resiliency to natural hazards or disasters were developed through collaboration with community members, and advance environmental justice by directly benefitting climate-vulnerable and under-resourced communities. The program of recommended projects will reduce greenhouse gas emissions, increase safety, protect natural resources, and implement active transportation improvements to reduce vehicle miles traveled and increase mobility options for Californians.

Program Status (Allocated from January 2024 to June 2024)

In Cycle 1 for the FY 2023-2024, eight projects were allocated with a total of \$20.569 million for their Project Approval and Environmental Document (PA&ED) phases and one project was granted a time extension (12 months) for Plans, Specifications, and Estimates (PS&E) phase. One project was allocated \$6 million, and one was granted a time extension (12 months) for their Construction (CON) phases. Of the 15 projects, nine projects were allocated in FY 2023-2024. Overall, 8.59% (\$26.569 million) of the total programmed funds were allocated, and 4.07% (\$1.082 million) of the total allocated funds were expended in FY 2023-2024. Since all nine projects are at the initial stage of their project delivery, no phase (component) is completed to date. Table 1 briefs the LTCAP Cycle 1 and Table 2 shows the distribution and allocation of LTCAP Cycle 1 funds in FY 2023-2024.
