





Kern County

- **Kern County** spans the southern end of the <u>Central Valley</u> Covering 8,161.42 square miles
- It's the third largest county by area in California
- The county has been referred to as "The Golden Empire" because of its rich history of gold, oil and ag production
- Today's economy is heavily linked to agriculture as well as oil, gas and mineral extraction
- There is also a strong aviation, space, and military presence, such as <u>Edwards Air Force Base</u>, the <u>China Lake Naval Air Weapons</u>
 Station, and the Mojave Air and Space Port
- Third most diverse economy in the nation
- Kern County is California's most productive oil-producing county-and the fourth most productive agricultural county (by value) in the United States

THE CITY OF BAKERSFIELD

- Bakersfield is the 9th largest city in California with a population of 411,109
- The city is a significant hub for both <u>agriculture</u> and <u>energy production</u>; currently fostering innovation and diversification in both sectors
- Growing presence in logistics, food processing, and advanced manufacturing that requires quality movement of goods and resources
- Uniquely placed geographically for commerce and quality of life; within a four-hour drive of 90% of California's population
- Aspiring to be the most business-friendly City in California; downtown is home to entrepreneurship hubs and corporate regional offices
- Investing heavily in community renewal and quality of life
- Home to beautiful natural amenities along the Kern River, including the longest municipal bike trail in the United States at 36.3 miles






UPCOMING PROJECTS IN KERN

58 Truck Climbing Lane

- Near Tehachapi, just east of Route 223 to 3.4 miles east of Broome Road. Rehabilitate roadway, construct truck climbing lane
- Install Transportation Management System (TMS) elements, wildlife crossings, upgrade lighting, median barrier, guardrail, bridge railing, rehabilitate drainage systems, and enhance highway worker safety


CENTENNIAL CORRIDOR

• 7th Movement: Centennial Corridor EB58 to NB99 Loop Connector

> In the City of Bakersfield – freeway-tofreeway loop connector from the eastbound State Route 58 freeway to northbound State Route 99









CENTENNIAL CORRIDOR


7th and 8th Movements

• 8th Movement: Centennial Corridor SB 99 to WB 58 Connector

> In the City of Bakersfield - freeway-tofreeway connector ramp, southbound SR 99 to eastbound SR 58

Kern River Parkway Bike Trail

Lake-to-lake Kern River Parkway longest municipal bike trail in US at 36.3 miles

Walk Isabella

Lake Isabella Blvd and Erskine Creek Rd: pedestrian and cyclist safety and accessibility improvements

ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS

- City Council adopted multi-modal safety as a top priority
- Recently recognized for our complete streets, neighborhood traffic calming and safe routes to schools efforts
- Friant-Kern Canal Multi-Use Path (ATP/CMAQ)

Along the Friant-Kern Canal, the 6-mile trail will connect 7th Standard Rd to the Kern River Parkway

Complete Streets: H St Corridor (ATP/CMAQ)

2.5-mile Corridor Improvements: Road-Diet, Roundabouts, Class II Bicycle Lanes, enhanced crossings, and sidewalk improvements







SIGNATURE PROJECTS

Chester Avenue Corridor Enhancements (RAISE)

Gateway to Downtown Bakersfield; streetscaping, lighting, Class II Bicycle Lanes, bulb-outs, and enhanced crossings

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr Blvd (TCC/HUD)

Mixed-Use Corridor – Active Transportation and Urban Greening; Class IV Bicycle Lanes, lighting, and enhanced crossings
