A statewide investment program of \$1,333,342,000




Funding levels by region:

- 1 North State and Sacramento: \$51,699,000 across 3 projects in Humboldt and Sacramento
- 2 Bay Area: \$278,629,000 across 7 projects in the MTC region
- 3 Central Valley: \$300,040,000 across 4 projects in the Central Valley
- 4 Central Coast: \$115,549,000 across 3 projects along the coast

TIRCP – Key for Modernizing Rail and Transit

- Since 2015, \$11.5 billion in funding has been awarded to 153 projects throughout the state
- ▶ Of this, over \$4.8 billion has been invested from TIRCP since 2023
- ▶ Total value of TIRCP investments since 2015 is over \$41.2 billion
- Builds on an additional \$5.1 billion approved in 2023 for transit agencies via a formula basis, pursuant to SB125



TIRCP – Cycle 8 Upcoming

- ▶ TIRCP Cycle 8 is on track to be awarded by April 2026
- Therefore, Cycle 8 Call for Projects is likely expected in the late Summer or Fall of 2025
- Specific fund estimate is to be determined, and is dependent on Transportation Improvement Fee revenue and Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds
