RESOLUTION FATP-2425-13

ISSUE:

Should the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve an allocation of \$34,236,000 for 18 locally-administered Active Transportation Program (ATP) projects, off the State Highway System?

RECOMMENDATION:

The California Department of Transportation recommends that the Commission approve an allocation of \$34,236,000 for 18 locally-administered ATP projects, off the State Highway System.

BACKGROUND:

The attached vote list describes 18 locally-administered ATP projects totaling \$34,236,000. The local agencies are ready to proceed with these projects, and are requesting an allocation at this time.

FINANCIAL RESOLUTION:

Resolved, that \$34,236,000 be allocated from the Budget Act of 2023, Budget Act Item 2660-108-0890 and Non-Budget Act Item 2660-608-0001 for 18 locally-administered ATP projects described on the attached vote list.
