







Improved Performance Metrics

Throughput

Excess of **800 daily trucks** passing through corridor

Velocity

Increase of **9 MPH** in eastbound direction and **6 MPH** in westbound direction

Reliability

Time savings up to **37 minutes** average travel time (eastbound PM peak hour)

Improve Bike and Ped Connections




