



The 12 District Community Engagement Playbooks

- Defines how roles work together
- Focuses on engagement continuity for District Plans and Projects
- Describes District-specific engagement "plays"
- Room for flexibility, customization: each district will structure the program on its needs

Note: Current requirements for public hearings and notices will still be maintained and included in the various new efforts and guidance documents.

Caltrans Engagement Portal

A WEB-BASED COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PLATFORM

- Collect, store, categorize, track, measure, retrieve, and respond to public comments for Caltrans plans and projects
- Provide continuity between all project phases from planning through project delivery
- Public-Facing Interface and Caltrans-Facing Interface

Caltrans Engagement Portal – Timeline


- May 2024: Launch to 18 Pilot Projects
 - Make minor system improvements based on use and feedback
- May 2025: Available to all Caltrans Projects
 - Monitor and pursue any large-scale improvements



Delivering Engagement

CURRENT EFFORTS TO BUILD ENGAGEMENT INTO CALTRANS PROJECT DEVELOPMENT PROCESSES

- Resource proposals to conduct and implement
 engagement
- Activities and Workflow (Work Breakdown Structure) formalizing engagement in the step-by-step processes of project development.
- Policy guidelines to achieve engagement outcomes



Project Initiation Documents (PID)

- PIDs are the first step in project development.
 - Why is PID engagement important?
 - Creates continuity from planning documents
 - Influences initial cost, scope, and schedule
 - Gives project teams time to identify and address community input related to a project
 - How is PID engagement conducted?
 - Context sensitive
 - Caltrans Engagement Portal and the Public Engagement Plans
- <u>New</u> PID Engagement Guidance/Training to aid districts in conducting early project engagement



Open For Comment Now

- Caltrans Public Participation Plan for the California Transportation Plan (CTP) and Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) until May 20, 2024
- Draft Caltrans System Investment Strategy (CSIS) Public comment open through April 15, 2024.
