


City of Milpitas GREAT MALL PARKWAY PHASE 2 RESURFACING PROJECT CTC Local Partnership Program

The Great Mall Parkway Phase 2 Resurfacing Project (Project) will improve the safety, accessibility, and quality of the City of Milpitas's (City) roadway infrastructure for residents, business owners, commuters, and visitors. The Project improves 4.2 Iane miles of Great Mall Parkway, East Tasman Drive, and Alder Drive by resurfacing the roadways with asphalt concrete pavement. The Project will also repair sidewalks, curbs, and gutters; install American Disability Act (ADA)-compliant curb ramps; provide Class II bike lanes with buffers; and install new roadway signage, high-visibility marked crosswalks and Accessible Pedestrian Signals push buttons. New and refreshed lane striping and pavement markings will also be completed as part of the Project. The proposed Project follows the successful completion of the resurfacing project completed in September 2024 (Phase 1) on the segment of Great Mall Parkway between I-880 northbound on/off ramp and McCandless Drive.

Funding Request: Total Project Cost: \$3,458,440

Project Schedule: Construction is anticipated to begin in the spring of 2026 and be completed by the end of the year 2026.
