


Ventura County in California's Transportation System

- US 101 is a key interregional coastal corridor
- Home to Port of Hueneme, a strategic deep -water commercial port and military deep -water port
- Supports statewide goods movement, agriculture, and military logistics
- Coastal corridor is vital for resiliency and emergency access



Connected Multimodal Transportation Network

- Interregional rail service along the LOSSAN Corridor
- Regional and local transit connects communities throughout the county and to the US 101 corridor
- Port of Hueneme provides maritime freight access
- Highway network supports goods movement and interregional travel

US 101 HOV/Express Bus Lane Project

- Improves mobility, transit speed, and reliability on statewide coastal corridor
- Supports mode shift and emissions reduction
- Enhances corridor efficiency and safety without general purpose widening



Hueneme Road Widening

- Improves goods movement reliability by eliminating the last bottleneck
- Supports port and regional economic activity
- Reduces truck congestion and diversion into neighborhoods
- Enhances active transportation with addition of bicycle lanes

- Ventura County's 2026 STIP proposal:
 - Supports a multimodal transportation system, including transit and active transportation
 - Advances improvements on a designated interregional corridor
 - Strengthens access to a strategic statewide freight gateway
