


Budget and Allocation Capacity Update

Presented to the California Transportation Commission

77% of 2015-16 Capacity Allocated

\$3.1 Billion Allocation Capacity



1. Includes authorized changes and project rescissions totaling -\$149 million for SHOPP and -\$49 million for STIP



Allocation Capacity Summary of Changes

- SHOPP roll-over capacity is approximately \$400 million
 - Extensions of 2015-16 SHOPP projects into August exceed the roll-over capacity
- STIP roll-over capacity is approximately \$36 million
 - Increase in STIP is a result of carryover, not an increase in overall capacity
- TCRP Majority of 2016-17 allocation capacity from \$148 million loan repayment expected by January 2017

Traffic Congestion Relief Fund (TCRF) Loan History Overview

- Between 2001-02 and 2004-05, suspended transfers and loans totaled approximately \$2.5 billion
- To date, a total of 15 repayments have left an outstanding loan balance of \$879 million
 - Repayment deadlines modified several times
 - Currently, there is no statutory repayment deadline for the remaining balance
- AB 133 appropriates \$173 million from the GF to provide for partial repayment by January 2017
 - \$148 million will be allocated to the TCRF



Traffic Congestion Relief Fund Loan History Overview (cont.)

AB 2928 establishes the TCRF and outlines a six-year funding plan totaling \$5.39 billion

Proposition 42 is approved, requiring gasoline tax revenues be used for transportation purposes

TCRF loans GF \$1.15 billion

Full suspension of TCRF transfer totaling \$678 million

AB 438 defers transfers to the TCRF for two-years, and authorizes loans from the TCRF to the GF. TCRF funding reduced to \$5.31 billion

Partial suspension of TCRF transfer totaling \$388 million

TCRF loans GF \$238 million



State Transit Assistance (STA) Transfers

- Each quarter the State Controller's Office (SCO)
 transfers a portion of diesel sales tax revenue from the
 PTA to local transit operators
- STA funds are allocated to local transit agencies by formula based 50 percent on population and 50 percent on operator revenues
- Proposed legislative changes impacting the revenue-based allocations has caused the SCO to delay the STA transfer that was expected in May
 - Has impacted local cash flows
