Program Objectives

Competitive grants for transformative capital investments

- » Expand and Improve transit/rail service to increase ridership
- » Improve system integration
- » Improve safety

Secondary objectives:

- » Benefits to disadvantaged and low-income communities (AB1550)
- » Multi-agency coordination
- » Geographic equity
- » Benefits to freight movement







TIRCP Projects and Project Management

Caltrans Role

- » Provide Program and Project Administration
- » Execute master agreements w/ awarded agencies
- » Utilize detailed program supplements to commit actual funds
- » Per TIRCP guidelines, program supplements will include:
 - » Project Description and Scope of Work
 - » Project Schedule
 - » Overall Funding Plan
 - » Project Financial Plan
- » Provide Semi-Annual Program Update Reports to CTC

TIRCP Partnerships

CTC Role

- » Allocate funds from adopted program
- » Provide letter of no prejudice for projects or project components
- » Work with CalSTA to implement multi-year funding agreements
- » Receive semi-annual program updates

CARB Role

- » Partner with CalSTA for evaluation and selection of projects
- » Ensure all projects achieve a reduction in GHG emissions using CARB quantification methodology
- » Receive reporting on GHG reductions and benefits to disadvantaged communities, low-income communities, and/or low-income households
